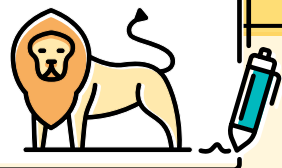

Daniel in the Lions' Den

DANIEL 6

King Darius chose 120 princes throughout his kingdom. He also chose 3 presidents to watch over the princes. He chose Daniel as 1 of his presidents. Daniel was trustworthy and honest, and the king planned to put him in charge of his whole kingdom.

The other leaders were jealous. They watched for Daniel to do something wrong so they could complain to the king. Soon, they realized that they would never find anything against Daniel unless it had something to do with his God. The leaders went to the king and said, "You should make a law that says for 30 days no one may pray to any god or man except you. If someone breaks the law, he should be thrown into the lions' den!" King Darius agreed and made the law.

When Daniel heard about the law, he went into his house, opened his window that faced Jerusalem, and got down on his knees. Then he prayed to God, three times each day, just as he had always done.

The leaders searched for Daniel and found him praying to God. They hurried to the king and said, "Daniel has ignored you, the king. He prays three times each day to his God." The leaders insisted that the king throw Daniel into the lions' den.

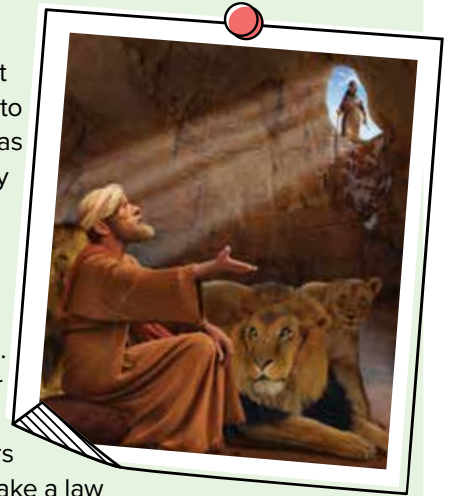
The king was upset, but the law could not be changed. As Daniel was thrown into the den, King Darius said, "May the God you serve rescue you!" A large stone was placed over the opening, and the king sealed the stone with his ring.

The king could not sleep all night. The next morning he hurried to the lions' den and called to Daniel. Daniel was alive and safe! He said, "God sent an angel and shut the lions' mouths. They haven't hurt me."

King Darius was overjoyed and gave orders to take Daniel out of the lions' den. The king wrote a new law that people in his kingdom should worship Daniel's God because He is the living God, and He rescued Daniel from the lions.
