God is powerful and in control of all things.





# Daniel in the Lions' Den

### **DANIEL 6**

Daniel followed God's commands. God made Daniel a strong leader. King Darius was so impressed with Daniel, he gave him a very important job. The other leaders working for King Darius were very jealous of Daniel and they wanted to get Daniel in trouble with the king. They could never find Daniel breaking the rules.

The leaders decided to find a way to get rid of Daniel. They went to King Darius and talked the king into making



a new law that could not be changed. For the next thirty days, no one in the kingdom could pray to anyone except King Darius. If someone broke this law, he would be thrown into the lions' den as a punishment. The leaders knew Daniel prayed to God three times a day.

When Daniel heard about the law, he immediately went home. He got down on his knees at the open window facing Jerusalem and prayed. The officials saw him praying and went to King Darius. They told him Daniel was praying to his God. The king was sad and tried to save Daniel, but he had no choice.

The officials placed Daniel in the lions' den. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you continually serve, rescue you!" The king spent the night without eating, and he could not sleep.

Early the next morning, the king hurried to the lions' den and cried out to Daniel. He heard Daniel say, "May the king live forever." God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths and they did not harm Daniel. The king was overjoyed and ordered to have Daniel lifted out of the den. King Darius issued a degree that all the people worship the God of Daniel.
